Read Genesis 3:8-13.

What do we see in this passage about the seeking heart of God? (verse 9)

DISCUSS THE SERMON

In his book 'The Knowledge of the Holy', AW Tozer writes, "What comes into our minds when we think about God is the most important thing about us. For this reason the gravest question before the Church is always God Himself, and the most portentous fact about any man is not what he at a given time may say or do, but what he in his deep heart conceives God to be like. We tend by a secret law of the soul to move toward our mental image of God."

What are some of the initial thoughts that come into your mind when you think about God? How might this be shaping your soul and your life?

What did the sermon teach or remind you about the heart of God?

APPLY THE TRUTH

In the sermon, we gave two practices to open ourselves up to the seeking heart of God.

- *Practice 1 Remember the Gospel.* Create a daily habit/discipline for rehearsing the good news of the gospel to yourself.
- Practice 2 Listening prayer. Create space at the start or end of each day to sit in silence and receive His love for you in Christ Jesus.
