


Question #1: When will the fruit come?

Lesson #1: The coming of the Lord is at hand.






example of suffering and patience, brothers, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast.






And what more shall I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets—who through faith






war, put foreign armies to flight. Women received back their dead by resurrection.




Some were tortured, refusing to accept release, so that they might rise again to a better life. Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment.



They were stoned, they were sawn in two, they were killed with the sword. They went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, afflicted, mistreated— of whom the world




was not worthy—wandering about in deserts and mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth.

You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, How the Lord is compassionate and merciful.




Question #3: Why is this happening to me?
