## **REVIEW THE MISSION**

Take some time to review who various people are building relationships with and seeking to share the gospel with.

Pray for these individuals - that God would open their eyes to the good news of the gospel.

## **PRAYER + SCRIPTURE**

**Open with a brief word of prayer:** "God, we thank you for this time together. We open our hearts to how you might want to meet with us. Allow us to hear your voice and experience your work among us. Come Holy Spirit."

#### 1-2 minutes of silent reflection.

#### Read Revelation 1:4-20

4 John to the seven churches that are in Asia: Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before his throne, 5 and from Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth. To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood 6 and made us a kingdom, priests to his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen. 7 Behold, he is coming with the clouds, and every eye will see him, even those who pierced him, and all tribes of the earth will wail on account of him. Even so. Amen. 8 "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, "who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty."

9 I, John, your brother and partner in the tribulation and the kingdom and the patient endurance that are in Jesus, was on the island called Patmos on account of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus. 10 I was in the Spirit on the Lord's day, and I heard behind me a loud voice like a trumpet 11 saying, "Write what you see in a book and send it to the seven churches, to Ephesus and to Smyrna and to Pergamum and to Thyatira and to Sardis and to Philadelphia and to Laodicea."

12 Then I turned to see the voice that was speaking to me, and on turning I saw seven golden lampstands, 13 and in the midst of the lampstands one like a son of man, clothed with a long robe and with a golden sash around his chest. 14 The hairs of his head were white, like white wool, like snow. His eyes were like a flame of fire, 15 his feet were like burnished bronze, refined in a furnace, and his voice was like the roar of many waters. 16 In his right hand he held seven stars, from his mouth came a sharp two-edged sword, and his face was like the sun shining in full strength.

17 When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But he laid his right hand on me, saying, "Fear not, I am the first and the last, 18 and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades. 19 Write therefore the things that you have seen, those that are and those that are to take place after this. 20 As for the mystery of the seven stars that you saw in my right hand, and the seven golden lampstands, the seven stars are the angels of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands are the seven churches.

## 1-2 minutes of silent reflection.

**Close with this short prayer:** ". Jesus, we pray that our time in this sermon series brings our attention to you, our Savior. May the Spirit help us worship Jesus more and be humbled, ready to receive correction by the words in your Holy Scripture. Amen."

## SERMON DISCUSSION

## WHAT IS A SUCCESSFUL CHURCH?

Starting off this sermon series, the question was posed: "What makes a church successful?" And we could have a number of different responses to that question. Things like

- The number of people in worship
- Owning our own building
- The size of our budget
- The number of changed lives, healed marriages, or developed leaders
- The amount of social good we do in the city

Coming into this sermon series, what tends to be your focus when evaluating the success of Citizens Church?

#### **FAITHFULNESS TO JESUS**

According to Jesus, success is not numerical growth, a building, a budget amount...it's not even the amount of people that come to faith in Him (though those are not all bad things in and of themselves).

The #1 metric for success for a church is faithfulness to Jesus.

Specifically, faithfulness in 4 things:

- In doctrine what a church teaches and believes.
- In holiness how a church lives out those beliefs.
- In love an earnest desire and affection for Jesus.
- In patient suffering how a church patiently endures the trials of this world as they wait for Christ to return.

In which of these four areas would you like to see your faithfulness to Jesus grow during this series?

## WHY WE ARE FAITHFUL TO JESUS

In the sermon, Tim showed us how Revelation 1 tells us to be faithful to Jesus for three reasons:

- What He has done The Gospel, freed us from sin + made us a kingdom of priests to God
- What He will do Conquer His enemies of Satan, Sin, and Death
- And Who He is the Holy and Glorious Messiah, King, and Judge

How does what Jesus has done, will do, and who He is, lead you into these steps of faithfulness in the weeks to come?

## **SERIES PRACTICE**

One of our key discipleship values as a church is that of practice. Moving forward, we are going to begin emphasizing various spiritual practices during each sermon series. These practices are meant to coincide with the theme of the series, and something we invite our church to practice as a part of their spiritual formation.

#### **PRACTICE #1 - FASTING**

In its most basic form, Biblical fasting is the intentional abstaining from food for a spiritual purpose. As Christians, we intentionally face the pain of hunger and lack to direct our hearts towards God.

For this series, we are encouraging individuals to fast from all food and non-water beverages from dinner Wednesday through dinner Thursday, as a means of focusing our attention on God and asking Him to deepen our love for Him. Although there is freedom to adjust this to fit your various circumstances or season.

#### PRACTICE #2 - WORSHIP THROUGH SONG

The second practice we are inviting our church family to participate in is that of worship through song. Singing is a great way to help connect what we believe in our minds to what we experience in our hearts.
