SERIES RECAP

For the past 1,800 years, millions upon millions of Christians worldwide have recited the Apostle's Creed as part of their corporate worship. Written shortly after the death of Christ, the Apostles' Creed summarizes foundational Christian beliefs. It is a helpful statement which unites the church, instructs the believer, protects against false doctrine, and points to a glorious God and what He desires for His people. Over the course of this series, we will explore the ancient creed together seeking to deepen ourselves in our ancient historic faith and, more importantly, in the God of our faith.

Let us read the Apostles Creed together to start the evening.

"I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to hell. The third day he rose again from the dead. He ascended to heaven and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty. From there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen."

PRAYER + SCRIPTURE

Open with a brief word of prayer: "God, we thank you for this time together. We open our hearts to how you might want to meet with us. Allow us to hear your voice and experience your work among us. Come Holy Spirit."

1-2 minutes of silent reflection.

Read John 14:15-18, 25-27:

15 "If you love me, you will keep my commandments. 16 And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever, 17 even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, for he dwells with you and will be in you. 18 I will not leave you as orphans; I will come to you.

25 "These things I have spoken to you while I am still with you. 26 But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you. 27 Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid.

1-2 minutes of silent reflection.

Close with this short prayer: "Jesus, we believe that your death, resurrection, and ascension led to the Holy Spirit being able to dwell within us. Spirit, help us see and believe that you dwelling in us means God is with us always. Help us praise and worship God because of this good news. Amen.

As you reflect on John 14:15-18, 25-27 what is the Holy Spirit showing or teaching you?

SERMON DISCUSSION

Let's have a discussion around these main points from Sunday's teaching:

GOD IS WITH US IN SUFFERING

When God sent the Spirit to be with us, He sent a Helper, Concoler, and Comforter. In our suffering, we can feel alone and isolated, especially distant from God. However the reality is that God is both <u>with</u> us in suffering and <u>in</u> us in suffering.

How are you encouraged by the Spirit's presence and peace in your suffering?

GOD IS WITH US IN TEMPTATION

The Holy Spirit being the Spirit of truth is meant to be placed in contrast to the enemy of God and His people, what the Scriptures call the devil, who works through lies and deceit. We heard that every sin starts with a lie about God. But the Spirit convicts us of sin, showing us where we are believing lies and deceit, while also pointing us to the truth in the glory of Jesus.

How does it/should it strengthen your battle with sin to know the Holy Spirit is in you as you fight temptation?

GOD IS WITH US IN THE CHURCH

On one hand, our church Gatherings are normal and ordinary. However, because the Spirit is with us, God is also present in a unique way when we Gather. When we gather, the Spirit works in us to mold us, change us, encourage us and convict us in unique and miraculous ways.

How should/does this belief in the Holy Spirit change your view of participation in the Citizens Worship Gathering?

SERIES PRACTICE

One of our key discipleship values as a church is that of practice. Moving forward, we are going to begin emphasizing one of our key spiritual practices during each sermon series. This practice is meant to coincide with the theme of the series, and something we invite our church to practice as a part of their spiritual formation.

During the Apostles Creed series, we are emphasizing the practice of Scripture. Getting into God's Word and getting God's Word into us is vital for helping form our doctrine and fuel our discipleship.

Spend some time before you close talking about what group members are reading, and how you can press into Scripture as a group this summer.

CLOSING PRAYER

Pray over what was shared in the discussion, for your group to be united in the gospel, and for help from the Holy Spirit to be shaped to be more like Jesus as we put God's ways into practice.
